

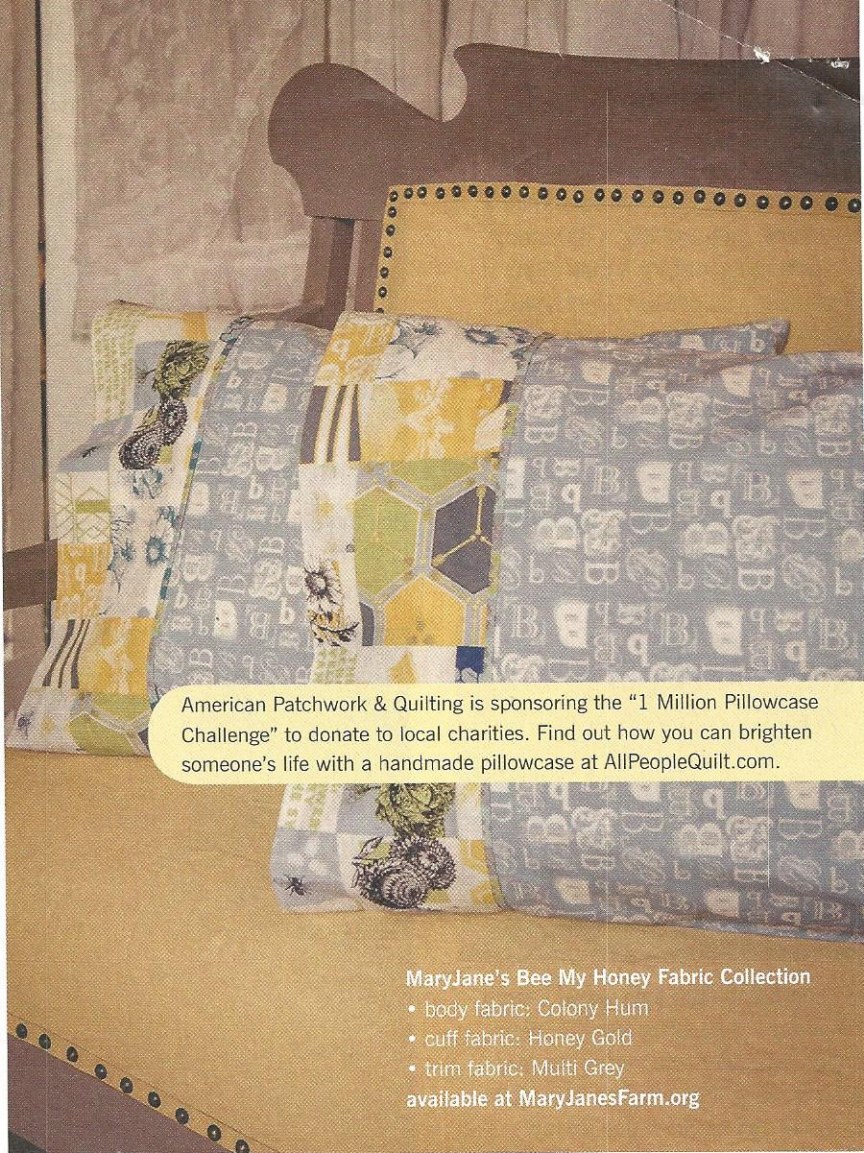
Make sure all sides and edges are square; if not, trim them.



Pin along raw edges, paying extra attention that the cuffs and trim are lined up where they meet. (Yes, you have the right sides of the pillowcase out—this will make French seams.)



Stitch a 1/4" seam along the raw side and end edges of the pillowcase (again, you will be stitching on the right side of the fabric—don't worry, more magic).

Remove pins. Turn pillowcase inside out, carefully push out corners with a point turner (or use a knitting needle or crochet hook), and press seams. Stitch a 3/8" seam (this will enclose the raw edges, making a French seam).



Turn pillowcase right side out, push out corners with a point turner (or use a knitting needle or crochet hook), and press seams again. You've finished your first pillowcase! Repeat all steps for the second pillowcase.
